



Rowing Report

While everyone else is on holiday the SPC Rowing squad is hard at work as the season gets into the first of the main regattas down at Lake Karapiro with the Christmas Regatta in mid-December and the Cambridge Town Cup at the end of January. Also the gruelling New Year's Camp takes place on the Waikato River for 7 days in early January and the work that the boys put in here sets them up for the rest of the season.

With schools from all over the North Island taking part in regattas at Lake Karapiro the competition is tough. Making an A-Final (fastest 8 qualifying crews) is very impressive and a B-Final (next 8 fastest) is also a great effort. Also for the smaller boats (e.g. singles and doubles) there is a much larger number of competitors in those events making it extra difficult to get into finals.
