While not all our boys will leave here with UE, it still remains our aspiration and must always be the objective.



# From the Deputy Headmaster (pastoral care) Brett Fricker

#### Welcome to 2016!

As always this is a busy time of the year as students (and parents) settle back in to the routines of daily College life. Timetables have to be sorted, homework completed, practices attended and lockers bought. It requires focus and organization and can be, honestly, a little tough at times. Sometimes such things can cause students to have moments where they 'act out' and are not their normal selves. And this is where the Pastoral arm of the College steps in to appropriately sort such moments. Our role is to look after the physical and emotional well-being of all St Peter's students. This includes, but is not limited to, attendance and lateness; Weekly Engagement Reports,; the College environs, for example, litter; counselling and so on.

As parents you can help with some of these by providing notes for absences and lateness. If you know in advance that your son will be away from school for personal reason, please phone Alison Strong, our Attendance Officer, on 524-8108x7341. If your son will be absent for a holiday or a non St. Peter's sporting event, Written permission MUST be sought from our Headmaster. He can be contacted via his PA on vvoordouw@st-peters.school.nz. Please also be aware that repeated unaccepted lateness and/or absence will result in the Head of Year contacting you. At the end of the day we want to work in partnership with you to grow your son so that he leaves in Year 13 as a well-rounded student with the grades to get him into the courses/jobs in which he is looking to enter. To do this he needs to be here at school and engaged in what he is doing.

To that end the Weekly Engagement Report begins this week. On Friday you will be emailed your son's engagement scores for all of his subjects provided they happen at least three periods in the week. A grade of 3 is average but we strongly encourage you to help us to encourage your son to aim for a grade of 4 or 5. This will indicate that he is engaged in that subject and the more your son engages, the more likely he is achieve in that subject. A grade of 1 or 2 is unacceptable and will result in Head of Year Intervention.

Please feel free to contact your son's Head of Year at any time with any question you may have, or with any information that will assist us to best work with your son.


In Year 11, there were 40 students that gained a Gold Tie where students needed a minimum of 4 A\*'s or A's in IGCSE or were awarded an Excellence Endorsement overall in Level One.

In Year 12, there were 6 students that gained a Gold Tie where students needed a minimum of 4 A\*'s or A's in AS Level or were awarded an Excellence Endorsement overall in Level Two.

The school had an impressive 121 students gain University Entrance last year who were all recognised.

In Year 13, there were 8 students that gained a White Tie where students needed a minimum of 360 UCAS in their 3 best A Level subjects or were awarded an Excellence Endorsement overall in Level Three.

The assembly was capped off by recognising the 22 scholarships that the school gained last year and the 4 Top of New Zealand awards in the 2015 Cambridge Examinations and Paulse Anithottam being Top in the World for IGCSE Mathematics.

After bowling first we were able to restrict them for 206 with Noah West taking 3 wickets. After a good start by Samuel Phillips and Rohit Rajagopal, we were unable to push on and were bowled out for 161. Our second game saw us playing St Laurence College. Lucas Dasent providing a great spell of 9 overs 4/32, kept St Laurence's to a reasonable score of 205. Stephen Fernandes (38) and Noah West (49) laid a great platform for SPC to push on towards the end of the innings. Needing 35 runs of 24 balls and no wickets remaining youngsters Joe Malloy and Lucas Dasent pulling through with a nail biting win.

After the close win we travelled to Gregory's Palace. Bowling first once again we manged to bowl them out for 171 with Lucas Dasent claiming 4/14 off his 10 and a great team fielding performance with 4 runouts. After the great bowling performance the boys were unable to string some runs together only pulling through to 111 with Noah West top scoring with 30. Once again in familiar fashion SPC were bowling first against St Pats Shorncliffe. With Jordan Ryall taking 2 early wickets and Lucas Dasent taking 3 more wickets St Pats were dismissed for 75 runs. Chasing low totals can always be hard and we made it look hard, scrapping through to 76/9. Lucas Dasent playing a well-crafted and sensible innings of 30 not out.



In the final game of the tournament SPC were facing the tournament favourites Nudgee College. Once again bowling first, Nudgee made their way through to 221 with Noah West taking 3 wickets and Caleb Olney and Lucas Dasent taking 2 each. After being 7/35 Zane McEntee and Tom Parsons brought SPC to a respectable score of 140, with Zane scoring the only 50 for SPC at the Tournament. with 13 wickets and making the Tournament Team. #### **Archery**

St. Peter's had 4 of their best shooters venture down to Wellington and compete in the 73rd New Zealand Outdoor National Championship. This was an internationally ranked event with shooters representing 6 overseas countries.

The first day was for sight-setting and practise. Wellington lived up to its reputation with gusts of up to 100kmph later on in the afternoon. This wind calmed to a standstill the next day, a relief to the shooters as the shoot, the 1440, WA the longest and most gruelling in the event. The proceeding day was slightly gustier, but still not as bad as the first day. This was the conclusion of the ranking round with our four archers performed extremely well. Chayse Martin-Roberts winning the silver medal. Matthew Storer earning bronze and Luke Franklyn placing 10th in one of the largest divisions at the tournament. Bailey Cox, in a different division and at his first outdoor nationals, won a gold medal. In the late afternoon, Chayse and his team won the team event, earning a gold medal.

The fifth and final day Wellington outdid itself on the weather front with torrential rain and gale force winds to the point that the arrows of the compound archers were being snapped off the targets like twigs. This resulted in the individual match play being abandoned much to the annoyance of **Chayse** and **Matthew** who were looking forward to hopefully facing each other in the finals.


