Weekly Engagement Report – 6 Guiding Principles for Parents

Any success St Peter's has achieved in the past is strongly connected to the support given from the home. As Mr Fouhy often states "we want to enrol the family, not only the student".

We are 6 weeks into the intervention system based on the Weekly Engagement Report (WER) and we thank you for looking closely at the scores each week and discussing these with your son.

To speak plainly, I have listed 6 techniques on how I think we can best work together towards obtaining / maintaining consistent in-class effort from your son.

- 1. Remember the scores assess engagement (effort and attitude) NOT academic performance.
- 2. Acknowledge a high score with your son.
- 3. If a low score is received ask your son "why". All students should have been told by his teacher the reason for obtaining a low score. (If he says he wasn't told it is possible his memory has temporarily escaped him!)

- 4. Continue to trust us. Teachers score as per the criteria below. The criteria will be your best source of understanding your son's scores.
- 5. Please postpone emailing a teacher directly until you see a "pattern" of low scores. If we are overly concerned about your son's pattern of scoring the Teacher, Head of Faculty or Head of Year will be in contact with you.
- 6. Set term by term goals with your son based on the WER scores.

For your reference I attach below the Weekly Engagement Report criteria for scoring. These criteria are also emailed to you each week below your son's scores.

Please feel free to email me directly if you have any queries as to the workings of the WER.

Middle School Report

Courage is a word that is often bandied around a lot. It can mean different things to different people. At St Peter's College we are looking for our young men to be men with courage. What do we mean by this and how do we want them to be courageous?

To start, it is about taking risks, doing activities or taking part in what will push yourself out of your comfort zone. This will be different for each student. The thought of getting involved in discussions in class can be terrifying and as teachers we need to encourage and motivate students to feel that they have something valuable to add to any class. That any question that is searching for more information is a good one.

Other students struggle to join a sports team as they feel they are not good enough or as it is a new school they do not know anyone in the team. At school there are so many different sports on offer that no matter what talent students have, there will be a sport for them. Granted not all students will be able to make the top rugby team, but if rugby does not work then this is not the end of the world. The courageous step is playing for the next team or finding another sport and getting involved in that.

Camp offers so much to all types of students, whether it be a chance to get out of the classroom and be active. Coming on camp though can be daunting, whether it be leaving the family for a few days or getting in the sea for a swim. There are students that show amazing courage by making it to camp!

One huge way that courage is shown is when students ask for help. In today's society it is often stated as the wrong thing to do! This is outrageous. Young men need to realise that there are tough times in life and there are people willing and able to help them, as long as they ask for help.

A different aspect of courage is owning up when one makes a mistake, it is taking responsibility for the wrong doing and stating that honestly, "Yes, it was me". Granted this is at times incredibly hard. Especially when a young man knows that there will be consequences for the mistake. In being honest from the start young men are being very courageous in what is a difficult time.

Students need to learn a valuable life lesson early and take this with them through life. Mistakes can happen, but by being honest they are showing maturity beyond their years.

It is a privilege to work in educating your sons and one part of this is encouraging them to be courageous in their life. This can occur in many different shapes and sizes. It certainly is not easy, however with parents and teachers working together with your sons, anything is possible.

1st XI upset St Kentigern in Gillette Cup Regional semi final

The 1st XI outplayed Auckland Secondary Schools One Day Champions, St Kentigern, to progress through to play in the regional final of the Gillette Cup.

The 1st XI went into the game quietly confident having dominated the Premier B one day competition. Captain, **Josh Plummer**, won the toss and elected to bowl. St Kentigern were well placed at 136 – 4 after 30 overs. However the game turned with the loss of three quick wickets. Tight bowling from off spinner **Caleb Olney** and medium pacer **Zane McEntee** turned the screws with only 14 runs conceded from the 30 to 40 over mark. St Kents accelerated the scoring in the final 10 overs to post a score of 222. 30 runs shy of what they were aiming for after the 30 over mark.

In reply opener **Eddie Webster** batted with poise to post a valuable 42 runs off 51 balls at the top of the innings. His 64 run partnership with Plummer laid the platform for the chase. Plummer then combined with **Jack Parsons** in a third wicket partnership that proved the winning of the game. The pair added 120 runs. The 1st XI sealed the win with Plummer hitting a boundary to bring up his third century for St Peter's.

This is the first time St Peter's has progressed through to the regional final of the prestigious Gillette Cup. The side are one win away from qualifying for the National Top Four Play Off's. The final is being played next Wednesday at Melville Park, 10am start.

Rowing - North Island Secondary Schools Championship

The North Island Secondary School Championships were held at Lake Kariporo, Mar 7 – Mar 9. With over 1900 involved in the regatta competition was fierce. The outstanding performance of the regatta came from the U18 Novice Coxed Four of Rory Baker, Caleb Dallow, Aidan Margetts, Matthew Bluck, Jack Baird (Cox). They finished fourth in the A Final narrowly missing out on a medal by a second.

Congratulations to **Joseph Kohlhase and Kalin Felise** who have recently been selected for the New Zealand U17 team.


Water Polo
