Why Science?

The Sciences have been increasing in popularity at St Peter's for a number of years. In fact, this year two thirds of our Year 12 students in both NCEA and CIE have chosen to study Physics. This increased interest in Physics, Chemistry and Biology contrasts with many other schools where students are opting out of these subjects in worrying numbers.

I believe there are several factors which have led to this positive trend at St Peter's. Science is taught here exceptionally well by highly qualified and enthusiastic teachers. There is a critical lack of specialist teachers in these key subjects nationally, so we are very fortunate at St Peter's to have such expert practitioners.

Additionally, boys are introduced to specialised Science classes in laboratories from Year 7; this is where that real spark and love of the subject is born. Finally, many parents encourage their sons down the Science route in the expectation that this will lead to specialised degrees in Engineering and Medicine, culminating in careers in these important fields.


Whatever the reason it is tremendous to see so many students opting into the Sciences. Our boys do however need to be mindful that the courses are difficult and demand consistent commitment: not all who opt into the Sciences achieve at the levels required.

And this year we'll have **hundreds of plants** for the green-fingered among you – or those who think it's time they gave their garden some love.



# From the Deputy Headmaster (pastoral care) **Brett Fricker**

Pastoral Care is about the well-being, physically and emotionally, of your son. It is about ensuring he is in the best possible space to maximise his learning opportunities and gain the qualifications he needs to progress beyond the College. To this end the Weekly Engagement Report (WER) is a key indicator of his engagement in a classroom as it can quickly show whether he is in the right space to learn.

The report will look at key factors like completing homework, participation in class activities, attitude to learning within the class and reading around the specific subject being taught. If your son is not in a focussed space to do these things, the WER will highlight that there is a problem. Here at school his teacher and/or his Head of Year may intervene by having a proactive discussion around why he is not engaged. This discussion may be extended to a meeting with you and your son to further discuss solutions and attempt to get your son back on track with his learning.

If these interventions do not work, the Head of Year may also issue a consequence such as a detention to try and get your son back into the right space. A worst case scenario may see a meeting with me which may then lead on to a meeting between parents and student with the Headmaster. It is therefore important that all parties communicate with each other to ensure the right course of action is taken with your son should he show signs of being unengaged. At the end of the day we are all working together to ensure your son's successful future.

We are delighted to announce that **Liam Netto** (12RIC) has won the regional final of the annual RSA Public Speaking competition. Pitted against representatives from eleven other Auckland secondary schools, **Liam** was judged the winner after delivering his speech on the service of New Zealand



nurses in the First World War. **Liam** will now proceed to the national finals in Wellington, where he will compete against seven other regional finalists in an event to be held at the national war memorial. The winner of the national finals will be taken to Gallipoli to be part of this year's Anzac Day services.

#### Musicians - Where are they now?

St Peter's College has seen a lot of brilliant young musicians pass through its ranks. It has provided excellent facilities for musical training for many years which allows boys to carry on with the profession in later years. I got in touch with some previous students of the St Peter's Music Department to shed some light on their current endeavours.

- Samuel Verlinden is a recent graduate of St Peter's College, graduating as Music Prefect for 2015. He has released many hit singles and appeared on shows such as the Erin Simpson Show and Sticky TV. Since leaving St Peter's he received a Scholarship from AUT to study a Bachelor of Communications. He also received a scholarship from ANZ to write and create a music video for his single "I just wanna love you". This video spread throughout the country and featured dancing from "Parris Goeble", a group which also featured in Justin Bieber's music video for "Sorry". Sam is currently in the process of writing songs for a future album.
- On the topic of Justin Bieber, **James Wong** is credited to have wrote a song on Justin Bieber's Latest album "Purpose" after graduating from St Peter's in 2004.
- Samuel McCarthy and Jordan Arts, students of the early 2000's, won the Smokefreerockquest with their band Incursa. Deciding to pursue their passion for music, they formed their own band. Their band, Kids of 88, was signed to a worldwide record deal with Sony Music in 2010, and they won Single of the Year and Music Video of the Year at the 2010 New Zealand Music Awards. They have since toured with Ke\$ha, released two albums and numerous music videos and even appeared on MTV's show "Teen Wolf".
- Taka Vuni, Christian and Austin Malietoa Brown, Fred Lewis, Liava'a Kulu. Since leaving St Peter's in various years, these old boys have formed their own choral group, "Klapa Samoana" which has toured

New Zealand, Croatia, Australia. **Taka, Christian** and **Austin** have all come back over many years to teach the next generation of young choral singers at St Peter's. **Taka** is also studying classical voice at Auckland University.

- **David Robertson** is currently studying a Bachelor of Music in Classical Flute Performance and Liberal Arts Conjoint at Auckland University, and now plays 2nd Flute for the Auckland Youth Orchestra.
- **Davyd Antipov** won the 2014 Rönisch Auckland Secondary Schools Piano Competition, and is currently studying a Bachelor of Music in Classical Piano Performance at Auckland University.
- Kenny Keppel is currently in his second year studying a Professional Performance Programme at the Australian National Academy of Music (ANAM). Kenny achieved a scholarship to attend the academy, which is an extremely sought after and prestigious institution only for the finest musicians in Australasian, meaning Kenny is playing in a world class establishment at an international standard. After leaving in 2010, Kenny pursued his love of music, spending 4 years in the Auckland Youth Orchestra and playing in the NZSO National Youth Orchestra Concert Series for July of 2014, as well as doing the NZSO Fellowship Programme in 2014, in which he spent a full year studying with and working alongside the members of our national orchestra. He also studied for 4 years in a Bachelor of Science/Bachelor of Music conjoint degree.
- **Erinc Yikar** started teaching Saxophone at St Peter's after he became an old boy in 2010. He left in early 2016 to pursue his studies at Auckland University
- **Tom Taylor,** finished bachelor's degree in Jazz Performance at Auckland University and now teaches percussion at St Peter's.
- **Lewis Wheatley** is currently studying jazz guitar performance at Auckland University
- **Shannon Coulomb** graduated in Jazz performance at Auckland University, and now teaches music at Manurewa High School.
- **Donald Saw** continued in music, completing music teaching degree at Auckland University. Since then, he has taught in New Zealand, England, Dubai and now teaches at an International School in Vietnam.

There are many more SPC old boys that kept being involved in music in one way or another and we will keep you updated about them and their lives in music.

Having seen all the examples of the quality of musicianship that has passed through this school, the Music Department encourages the students of St Peter's to take advantage of the facilities and programmes available to you, and to participate in your music classes and ensembles. #### Central East Zone Athletics

St Peter's had 20 students competing across the various events in this year's newly formed Central-Eastern Zone athletics meet. The additional inclusion of St Kentigern and Sacred Heart has made this a more competitive event compared to previous years. We qualified 12 athletes for next Wednesday's Greater Auckland athletics championships. James Guthrie-Croft and Oliver Miller barely broke a sweat and dominated their fields in all events - notable performances included Oliver's 1.96m high jump (a new personal best) and James' 100m and 200m double for the third year running. Our new junior athletes competed well, with Truman Tepai throwing 2nd in the junior discus and Joseph Lee gaining third in the junior high jump. The event closed on a high with a stunning performance from our senior 4 x 100m relay team who outran their rivals at an efficient 44.25 seconds; despite fielding 2 non-seniors in the event. The open boys 4 x 400m relay team also ran well to finish second.







