Students Missing NCEA Internal Assessments

NCEA Internal Assessments occur throughout the year at St. Peter's. To find out more information about criteria and deadlines please look on the College website under:

1. Academic Menu, Academic Guides (pdf called 2016 NCEA Internal Assessment

Deadlines) or

2. On the Home Page on the scrolling banner with the icon below:

It is the responsibility of your son to ensure that he is aware of when each Internal Assessment is on and to be present at school to sit all of these assessments.

If your son misses an Internal Assessment due to a medical reason then a medical certificate needs to be provided for the school. The Deputy Headmaster Curriculum will sign off on this.

If your son is away from class representing St Peter's in sport or on a St Peter's trip then this will be deemed a legitimate reason and another deadline will be provided.

If there is any other reason for your son to be away from school this needs to be approved by the Headmaster. Please contact Mrs Veronica Voordouw (Headmaster's PA) well in advance of the absence to gain permission.

Faculties where students have a legitimate reason to miss an NCEA Internal Assessment will then arrange a separate time for students to complete this.

Academic Tracking

The Year 13 Academic Tracking evening is occurring on Monday the 11th April in Week 11. At this evening parents of every Year 13 student along with their son are expected to attend to discuss the progress that he is making in 2016 and what the predictions are for his academic achievement at the end of the year.

This meeting will be with a senior member of staff from the Senior Leadership team or Head of Year 13 or the academic deans and go for 7 minutes. Times can be made between 4pm and 6.30pm.

Meetings can be set up using the St Peter's College Portal and please select one time slot for you and your son to meet with a senior member of staff. Once the portal is open, parents will be emailed with instructions on how to select a time slot for their son.

Middle School News

Term One is well underway and it certainly has been very busy in the Middle School. With the Easter break behind us, the focus now can turn back to academics and it is important that parents, students and teachers are all working towards the same goal to achieve the best possible success for the young men of St Peter's College.

In Mathematics, many students come to the Middle School without a strong grasp of their times tables. Whilst this is not the only maths knowledge our students need, it is a very important aspect of their learning. A student who has instant recall of their times tables has confidence in their ability to solve ever more complex mathematical problems. It is therefore vitally important that they put some time into learning their times tables and the corresponding division facts.

We would ask that if your child is struggling in this aspect of their learning that you spend 20 minutes each day working on this with them. Growing the number knowledge of our students is also a priority in our classrooms this year and we would hope that by working in partnership with home we will be able to strengthen each student's ability to improve their confidence in this important curriculum area.

Additionally, when discussing reading habits with students it is evident that many have never independently read a book from beginning to end. In order to be successful at school (and onwards) it is vitally important that our students can read and understand a variety of texts. As they read our students grow their vocabulary and their knowledge of the world around them. As their comprehension improves, they become more able to access the wider school curriculum and this directly supports them at secondary/ tertiary level. The examinations they take in Years 11-13 require them to be able to read and understand at a high level, in all subjects, not just English.

Once again, your role in supporting your child to develop the literacy skills they need to be successful is one of encouraging them to read every day (and to finish books); to talk to them about what they are reading, and finally, to model reading to them – students who see the adults around them reading are much more likely to become good readers themselves. We suggest that 20 to 30 minutes of focused reading every day will be of great benefit to all students.

It is all about working together so that the best possible outcomes will occur for your sons. Making sure that these two activities are happening will go a long way to ensuring every possible success this year and the many years ahead.

Gene Genie: Genetics and Health

Museum on March 22nd. It was chaired by visiting British geneticist Dr Adam Rutherford of BBC Radio 4's Inside Science. The panel included Dr Don Love from the University of Auckland who pioneered the discovery of the gene mutation associated with Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy. Greater Auckland Athletics Champs – Wednesday 23rd March

This year's event was marked by a sense of déjà vu. The unseasonal weather revived recent memories of the wet and windy St Peter's athletics day in February. Strong winds and intermittent bouts of rain made conditions for the athletes extra challenging. Our group of 12 athletes competed very well considering the circumstances, winning a final haul of 6 gold and 4 silver medals.



The team was led from the front by **Oliver Miller** 12ODR (athletics code captain), who himself achieved a hat-trick of gold medals in the open 300m hurdles, senior 400m and senior high jump. **James Guthrie-Croft** 13LYN continued his dominance in the intermediate 100m, 200m and long jump events, winning all three. This is the third year in a row that James has won all three events. **Stephen Thorpe** 10BOD performed consistently throughout the day gaining silver medals in the junior 300m and junior long jump events.



Our senior relay team came agonisingly close to repeating their winning performance from the previous week, but had to settle for silver. A special mention to **Stephen Thorpe** for running in the senior team as a junior. A few other performances deserve a mention, namely **Liam Barry's** 4th place in the intermediate 3,000m and Truman Tepai's 4th place in the junior discus. Both are hopeful of selection for the Auckland team in the North Island Championships in early April. Finally, **Aleks Dabek** 13BOD rolled back the years and ran a superb 5th in the senior 800m, at a fast time of 2:06:11, close to a SPC senior 800m record! Our focus now shifts to the North Island Athletic Championships on this weekend at Mt Smart.
