Upon being appointed as Headmaster late last year I also had the title of PCBU conferred upon me. Many of our parents will also be PCBUs in their places of work. PCBU stands for 'person conducting a business or an undertaking' and is the result of the new Health and Safety at Work Act which came into play last week. At a recent Principals' Conference I attended, this new Act was a hot topic of discussion. The concern for all PCBUs is that the finger of responsibility points directly at them, with enormous potential consequences such as six figure fines and prison sentences.

The paramount importance of Health and Safety in schools is nothing new. As you would expect all principals take this responsibility enormously seriously, and as a result the education sector has an extremely impressive track record when you consider the number of children and staff that have passed through school gates over the years.

The accident that occurred during the St Kentigern College production last week has made the consequences of this act very real for schools and principals. Whilst the facts are still to be ascertained, what you can confidently say is that nobody involved in that production, let alone the Headmaster, set out to deliberately place a student at risk of injury. All schools are now watching the outcome of this episode with interest as the very nature of schools, in their sheer size of numbers, means there is always an element of risk. St Peter's, with our 1350 boys and 130 staff, could be viewed as a large company in a New Zealand context.

This act has worthy intentions, but many commentators are of the opinion that it is fixated on blame – somebody, somewhere must be held accountable. To ensure compliance the act has put in place punitive measures which no PCBU will be able to ignore. Already there are whispers that schools will abandon activities such as school camps, kayaking and tramping.

What a national tragedy this would be. Many will tell schools to relax and persist with these activities, something very easy to say when it is not them staring down the barrel of a \$600,000 fine. Let us pray that common sense prevails and schools can continue to offer the broad range of activities that is expected in our education system.



For the second year in a row, the Performing Arts portfolio sent a St Peter's College team of Year 12 boys to compete in the Otago University Sheilah Winn Shakespeare Festival held by the Shakespeare Globe Centre (SGCNZ). The festival is an annual event started in 1992 that involves more than half of the secondary schools in the country and is broken into two parts: Regional and National Festivals. The Regional Festival is where students perform their choice of either a 5-minute or 15-minute extract from any of Shakespeare's plays and compete against other schools in the area. The top schools from each region are then selected to participate in the National Festival held in Wellington.

I had the pleasure of directing the group of 7 Year 12 boys in our own rendition of Act 1 Scene III of Macbeth. The boys played as modern day businessmen to put their twist on the scene and gave a very fresh approach to the writings of Shakespeare. This certainly fulfilled the competition criteria that performances may be set in any context, period or place, as long as the essence and integrity of Shakespeare play is retained and the words must remain the same. The scene we used tells the story of how the three witches (top CEO's of the business played by Fulton Ryan (12BOD), Finn McDonnell 12NOL and Aditya Patel (12RIC)) meet Macbeth and Banquo (the young interns played by Andrew Johnston (12RIC) and Luke Cameron (12ODR)

respectively) and fortell the prophecy of Macbeth's promotions. Macbeth is baffled by these predictions and does not believe them to be true until Ross and Angus (the firm's secretaries played by **Zach Blackburn** (12LYN) and **Seth O'Connor** (12TRE)) come and congratulate Macbeth on his new role as Thane of Cawdor.

The boys did an outstanding job and were unfortunate to miss out on regional placing. Of the 49 performances, only one from each time division is selected for performance in Wellington, so the boys did themselves very proud and the performance was a huge improvement from last year. The boys would also like to thank **Miss O'Leary** for all her wisdom as the teacher in charge and for putting in her time and effort to help us.

North Island Secondary Schools Athletics Championships

Mt Smart April 1st - 3rd

The final event of a long summer athletics programme had 6 St Peter's College athletes selected to represent the Auckland province against other provincial teams from across the whole North Island at Mt Smart. A final haul of 11 medals across all the events was a superb return from our representatives. Unsurprisingly, Oliver Miller (12ODR) and James Guthrie-Croft (12LYN) dominated their respective running events and came away with a North Island record each. James broke the intermediate 100m record with a season best time of 10:91 seconds. Oliver managed to break a 36 year old record stretching back to 1980 by running a 48:55 second time. Additional medals were won by these two exceptionally talented athletes; each gaining 4 medals each.



Young prodigy **Stephen Thorpe** (10BOD) came away with an impressive win in the junior 300m race with an excellent 37:85 second time which won gold and set a new PB time. Another gold was won in the junior 4 x 100m relay by **Stephen**. **Liam Back** (10TRE) came away with a fine performance to win bronze in the junior 1500m race and narrowly missing out on beating his own PB for the event.

Liam Barry (12TRE) ran well in the intermediate 3,000m race, also narrowly falling short of a PB. Finally, young thrower **Truman Tepai** (9BOD) gained his first experience in the junior discus, but fell short of winning silverware in a highly contested event.

Rowing

The St Peter's Rowing Squad had a successful regatta at this year's week long Maadi Cup that was held at Lake Ruataniwha, in Twizel. St Peter's Rowing keeps on growing each year, with the largest squad ever travelling down to the South Island to compete. Two years ago St. Peter's college sent down to Twizel only 10 athletes to compete at the Maadi Cup, this year we sent down 28 rowers to compete and with that majority of the squad made either an A or B Finals.

The Maadi Cup regatta is the largest school sports event in the Southern Hemisphere with over 2200 students from 122 schools entered. Over 600 races took place over 52 events.

Although the St Peter's rowing squad did not get as many medals as we had hoped for, the depth of the squad is becoming stronger, as last season the squad made a total of 4 A Finals and this year we made 5 A Finals. The squad also made a number of B Finals, with many boys gaining top 10 placings in their respective boat classes. The stand out success was the Bronze Medal won by the U16 Coxed Four: Matthew Callaghan (12 LYN), Luca Hayward (11 RIC), Leo Ngatai-Tafau (11 TRE), Benjamin Pendreigh (12 LYN), Harry Molloy (11 LYN) (cox).




















Glendowie Boating Club

Section 103 of the Education Act 1989 lists the categories of persons who are not eligible to be elected, appointed or co-opted as trustees. The list is set out below.

A person who:

- is an undischarged bankrupt; or
- is prohibited from being a director or promoter of, or being concerned or taking part in the management of, a company under sections 382, 383 or 385 of the Companies Act 1993; or
- is a permanently appointed member of the Board staff, unless they are standing for election as a staff representative; or
- contracts or sub-contracts with the Board without the approval of the Secretary of Education and receives payments exceeding \$25,000 in any financial year (this provision is set out in section 103A of the Education Act). This would also cover situations where a person has a 10% or more shareholding in the contracting company or a company that controls the contracting company; or
- is subject to a property order under the Protection of Personal and Property Rights Act 1988; or
- is a person in respect of whom a personal order has been made under that Act that either the person is not competent to manage his or her own property affairs, or does not have the capacity to communicate/make decisions relating to his/her welfare/personal care; or
- is a person who has been convicted of an offence punishable by imprisonment for 2 years or more, or who has been sentenced to imprisonment for any other offence, unless that person has obtained a pardon, served the sentence, or otherwise suffered the penalty imposed on the person; or
- is not a New Zealand citizen, and is
 - > a person to whom section 15 or 16 of the Immigration Act 2009 applies; or
 - a person obliged, by or pursuant to that Act, to leave New Zealand immediately or within a specified time, being a time that was less than 12 months; or
 - deemed for the purposes of that Act to be in New Zealand unlawfully.

No person who has been appointed returning officer for an election of trustees is eligible to be nominated as a candidate in the election.

A student representative is a student (other than an adult student) enrolled full-time in year 9 or above at a school administered by the Board.

Section 103B Requirements before Appointment

Before a person is elected, co-opted, or appointed as a trustee, the person must confirm to the governing board that he or she is, to the best of his or her knowledge, eligible to be a trustee, having regard to the grounds of ineligibility in section 103.
