Can we have too much of social media?

If this question was asked of Konrad Hurrell, Judith Collins or many of the sporting celebrities – they would probably say “yes”!

Twitter/instagram and their cousins are about recording history in the moment – unlike anything we have seen in the history of humankind.

There is no doubt that social media acts as a disinfectant to truth. It exacts accountability and standards about human beings – especially those in high office. Social media does not allow the privacy of failure or about correction of failure.

And yet we know human beings fail and need to be reconciled to failure.

Social media is about writing records for all time. Boys don't always appreciate that what is written is recorded – the casual slugging of someone, the frustration of the moment in writing – recorded for all time(!).

I have had some major concerns that the constant digital connection of many boys will lead to a distortion of what it means to be human:

- The ability to speak to another person.
- The ability to express frustration without violence.
- The tendency to be controlled by what someone else sends down the social media pipeline.
- The ability to reflect.

That was the background to the **device free time zone** established this year for morning breaks and lunchtime. On the whole the initiative has been accepted by the boys with very good co-operation.

There was more movement around the field in term 1. There were less pockets of boys sitting around texting to each other.

Hopefully there is more interaction between all levels of the school.

The deciding criteria of many issues is balance. I don't think the constant 'anywhere, anytime, anything' connection is balanced and a correction is needed.

We need St Peter's men to be connected in a modern digital world. But we also need them to live a balanced life, to appreciate music, to be fit, to have faith and to be a critic and conscience of the world they own.

If social media gives us these qualities, then we can never have enough.

Connect - Engage - Perform

Boys don't learn subjects, they learn teachers. They will connect and perform if they respect the teacher and because simply - they do not want to let the teacher down. It is the same with sports coaches and any form of leadership that requires influence over others.

- Sports, Music, Cultural groups, Production, Service groups are all co-curricular.

- The Heads of Years at each year level are conducting an analysis of co-curricular involvement of all students.

- Any student not involved in co-curricular will be given strategies how to become involved.

- 87% of students committed in 2013. We want to increase it even more this year.

Senior Mid Year Trial Exams

Senior Mid-Year NCEA Trial Exams take place in week 5, Tuesday 3rd –Friday 6th June – Monday 2nd is Queen's Birthday

There will be no timetabled NCEA lessons for Years 11, 12 and 13 in that week. Year 11, 12 and 13 CIE lessons are scheduled as normal. Students following a CIE based programme will attend school as normal in that week.

Senior Mid-Year CIE Trial Exams take place in week 6, Monday 9th June – Friday 13th June

There will be no timetabled CIE lessons for Years 11, 12 and 13 in that week. Year 11, 12 and 13 NCEA lessons are scheduled as normal. Students following an NCEA based programme will attend school as normal in that week.

Students taking IGCSE Papers in Years 9 and 10 do not have a trial exam in this week.

This set of exams uses the Hall as the main exam centre. The muster area for the Hall is the main Hall entrance.

Your son will receive his official exam timetable well in advance. For exams that take place in the Hall, students are expected to be at the muster area by 8.15am at the latest for the morning session. For the afternoon session, students are expected to be at the Hall at 12.10 at the latest.

PARKING ON SITE

Due to the construction of the new teaching block parking on site has been severely restricted. Over 50 staff are now unable to park within the school. Parking along the driveway, around the gym and in front of the hall has been allocated specifically to staff. If parents have appointment at the College please ensure you park in the Visitors spaces in front of the technology block and not in staff parking. Your cooperation in this matter is appreciated.

Students will be notified of exams that do not take place in the Hall. The arrival times remain the same for exams that do not take place in the Hall.

Students will NOT be attending Yard Assembly during this week. Each day's exam session will be complete by 3.30 pm. Students are advised that in the time period between exams the school is in session as normal for Years 7-10 and that this is respected fully. The Library is available for study during these time periods.

Student Requirements

- Full School Uniform is a pre-requisite of attendance at any exam
- Students to check with respective teachers with regard to additional for the exam such as calculators.
- All exam refill paper is provided by the school.
- Students to bring stationery in a clear plastic bag.
- Students should avoid bringing objects of personal value, iPads, iPods etc

As per CIE and NCEA exam regulations, cell phones are strictly forbidden in the exam hall.

General News

Spirit of Adventure

Every voyage is different from the other ones. The weather patterns will change. (Voyage 662, for example, usually had variable five to ten knots, easing to five in the afternoon, with no rain throughout the voyage). The marine and avian wildlife constantly move around, and are never in the same place twice (I saw dolphins, penguins and a stingray, in addition to three Takahē, but no whales). The crew will be different (our captain's voyage will be his last for a while). The ship's path will change (we went to Treasure Island, Great Barrier island and Tiritiri). But the most important change is the hands. The 40 trainees, who turn a 286 ton hunk of metal and wood into a ship, an ordinary voyage into an adventure that shall never be forgotten.

You learn a lot on the voyage. You learn how to do housework, how to sweat and tail, what pan-pan means, what the jib, flying jib and fore staysail are. You learn how to make reef knots, bowlines, stopper knots and the like (I can't remember how to do them anymore, to be honest). You learn what the mizzen is, how many phrases originate from ships ("cut me some slack!") and the words "two, six, HEAVE!" will never be forgotten. But those aren't important. What is important is the sense of freedom you get when you set sail from anchor. Moving with nothing but the wind in your sails, knowing that's because you helped put them up. You will be completely independent from school, your friends and family. You won't have to wear the masks that people knew you by; you can relax and be yourself. I think I can honestly say I got to know some of the other hands in ten days better than I know people who've been in class with me since day one at SPC.

I swam with the fishes in the dark, before the sun rose. I climbed Mt Hobson, gaining 'the most enthusiastic about tramping award'. I saw three

Takahē together, more than 1% of the global population. I have watched the sun rise and the sun set at the horizon. I spent ten days at sea in which the only electronic devices I used were a camera and a flashlight. There were no phones, computers or iPods on the voyage. For most of the voyage, I didn't read at all, which is unheard of for me. I used so much sunscreen, I probably lost some of my tan. I swam every day, sometimes completely around the Spirit. These are experiences you cannot have at home. But you can have them on the Spirit.

As stated previously, every voyage is different, and part of the excitement is the surprise at what might happen. Because of this, I have been purposefully vague, only giving concrete details on events that only might happen in future voyages or which you will learn about before the voyage.

The voyage cost \$1900. I missed eight days of class, and I struggled to catch up. But I don't regret my decision to take part in the voyage. It was completely worth it and more besides.

P.S. take your camera with you constantly, take lots of pictures, and ask your new friends to take pictures of you. The most important thing you will have is your camera. Take it.

Inline Hockey

At the end of last term **Max Vesper** in Year 8 at SPC was invited to trial for the upcoming Oceania Inline Hockey Championships to represent The Northern region to play against Australia and also to trial for the New Zealand 12 and under team. Max has been selected to play for the Northern Region and also for New Zealand in the Oceania Inline Hockey Championships to be played in Hamilton commencing 03 July 2014. Here is his report:

"I have played In Line Hockey for the last 4 years. I love it! Its fast, exhilarating and loads of fun. I've made some really good friends since I've been playing.

I will quickly explain how the game works. It's a sport where you have 8 to 12 players split into 2 or 3 lines of 4 players per line.

The aim is to try and score the most points by shooting in the opposition's team's goal. You can only have 4 players and a goalie on at a time for each team and if you get caught with more than 4 players you can get a penalty

If you incur a penalty for tripping boarding or any other reason the guilty player must sit in the penalty box for 90 seconds reducing your team to only 3 players

In the event of a penalty the coach will normally play his best 3 defensive players to hold off the opposition for the 90 second period. The positions are 2 forwards and 2 backs. Forwards do most of the shooting and decking players while the defensive players pass it up to the forwards and take some hard shots from halfway.

Inline hockey is a team sport where you need to work together if you want to win. I'm really proud of my achievement of representing New Zealand after all my hard work I've poured into this sport. I'm so excited to be involved in the Oceania Championships."
