The Value of Exams

We are currently in the midst of exam season and a regular question our students ask staff is, "What is the point of exams?" The method of exams to assess learning has received bad press lately, particularly overseas. American Educational Psychologist, Joseph Renzulli has dismissed exams as the new version of the Three R's, "Ram, Remember and Regurgitate". The usefulness of any assessment is in the way it is written and how it is presented to students. At St Peter's our staff place a lot of emphasis on the development of their exams.

Our philosophy is that:

- Exams are a method to measure a student's learning at a point in time.
- They are a tool which enables teachers to provide current feedback to students and parents about learning.
- Revising for an exam in June, on a topic learnt in February, can generate another whole level of learning.
- Exams allow teachers to gauge their students' progress and identify strengths and weaknesses. Subsequent teaching can then be adjusted to recognise these.

Here at St Peter's, as indeed in all New Zealand schools, exams are just one of the many tools used to assess learning. Projects, essays, portfolios and practicals are just a few of the many assessments methods utilised.

Whilst we appreciate that exams can be stressful on boys and families the value of them is most certainly meaningful.







Daniel Cameron – Selected in the New Zealand Water Polo 200 Cadet Squad. He will travel to Sydney in July with the team to play in a tournament.


Under 15 Fundraising


