'Sorry for Being a Man'

One of the skills of any modern leadership position is to develop a camera contrite posture and know how to apologise to a mass audience.

These skills are needed because with everyone striving for perfection in everything – imperfection surprisingly still occurs! As Leonard Cohen's refrain goes: "There is a crack in everything. It lets the light in."

But the recent political apology for 'being a man' - takes 'sorry' to a new level.

Apologies used to be about the individual, delivered from the heart and a genuine attempt to heal a wrong. It was always about the other. This mass produced apology has all the hallmarks of a political statement for a mass audience in an election year.

My thoughts when I heard those political words – how would parents of boys explain that statement to their sons? "I am sorry that you came into the world - a boy!" Really!

Apology for being a man is more than a silly statement. It demeans the nature of an apology and demeans the nature of being a man.

Instead of scapegoating all men, the real issue is how we educate young men to be confident, secure, respectful individuals who know how the team works, know how the world works and how we all make life better. A.M.D.G. Ad Majorem Dei Gloriam - All for the Glory of God.

Far from apologising for the maleness of St Peter's College and its 1200 students, we should rejoice at the privilege of being able to work with outstanding men. We are in the business of boys – through their good times and not so good times – and have done this for 75 years!

The phrase from scripture often sticks in my mind: "Which of you would give your son a

stone, when he asks for bread?"

Even despite the context of the political audience – the apology for being a man was simply "a stone"!

My language is my awakening, my language is the window to my soul

The St Peters Whanau Committee are very proud of the ways in which St Peters celebrate our Maori culture - from mandatory Te Reo Māori (Māori language) for Years 7 to 9 to the performing of haka by our entire School. This week is Māori Language Week – a great opportunity to celebrate not only Māori language but also Māori culture, and a good reminder for us all at St Peters that we have two official spoken languages in New Zealand.

This is the perfect time to have a go at incorporating Te Reo into your conversations. Start with greeting people with "kia ora" or find out what your name means in Maori and adopt your newfound Maori name for a few weeks (you might find you like it and decide to keep it!). Don't be concerned if you pronounce things a little incorrectly. We have a beautiful language which "sings" when it is used correctly so if you are not sure, ask a Maori brother or sister to help.

There is a raft of free resources to help you in your Te Reo journey – http://www.korero.maori.nz/news/ mlw being a great starting point. If you want to further embrace our beautiful language, have a look at one of the many free Te Reo courses available (Unitec and AUT to name just two).


