# Learning Mathematics – What's the answer?

The Numeracy project was recently dismissed by a respected study as being an abject failure in the teaching of Mathematics in this country. Even Minister Parata has acknowledged that schools now need to take a different direction.

The Numeracy project was a Government initiative set up in 2000 which expected schools in the primary and intermediate sectors to move away from the fact aspects of Mathematics, instead encouraging students to develop broader strategies to solve problems. The issue with the Numeracy project was that it put the cart before the horse. Mathematics strategizing is an essential skill, however you need to have a sound grasp of the basics, such as how to multiply and divide before you can get to this. Naturally many students didn't have this factual base to begin with. This type of teaching created more and different obstacles for these students, and unfortunately has put an entire generation of students off the subject.

At St Peter's we abandoned the numeracy teaching strategies over a decade ago. Instead boys are taught the fundamentals of Mathematics such as times tables, fractions and algebra. We believe this more traditional type of teaching enables boys to grasp the subject earlier, and when capable, they are able to move into higher levels of problem solving. Mathematics is a wonderful pure subject that teaches logic, problem solving and other essential skills. Sometimes it can be hard. Sometimes it can be frustrating. However, here at St Peter's we strive to ensure that all boys develop a solid grounding. This, we believe, has enabled our boys to perform extremely well in CIE and saw last year 92% of our Year 11 students achieve between 13 – 25 credits in NCEA Level One.

A strong culture of Mathematics is vital for our boys to succeed in the subject. The Outhwaite Building is a wonderful new resource for boys and staff. Our Mathematics floor is to be named after Brother Vin Jury, a master Mathematician, beloved by countless Old Boys.

Keeping old traditions alive is reminder to us that Mathematics mimics nature, and nature reflects the glory of God.

# From the Assistant Headmaster (Middle School) Michael Mullin

With life happening at a million miles an hour and the term two rushing to a close, it is a tough time to stop, but a crucial time to take a step back and remind ourselves of some important issues facing the young men in society today.

### Safe Internet Use

Today's wired kids are exposed to a host of risks that we as young people never faced. Talk to your son daily about their computer and smartphone use and social media habits, use filters that screen inappropriate content, and let them only use their iPad in a public part of your home. Many sites are geared for age 13 and older, so it is important to regularly check what they are up to on their devices. And young men should not accept friend requests from strangers.

### Bullying

Bullying does occur and here at St Peter's College we will do everything possible to stop it and to help those who are impacted by it. Teach your child how to handle bullying: Walk away and stay away, and talk to a teacher or parent you trust if you feel bullied. Do not forget that at times your son might be the bully: Teach them that differences do not mean someone is less than they are, and remind them to stop and think before saying or doing something hurtful.

#### Cyberbullying

It can be even easier for kids to bully online, when a real person is not in front of them. To protect your son from cyberbullying, teach them to be smart about what they put online, and not to share anything that could be used to embarrass or hurt them. Remind them not to share passwords, and to use security controls on sites like Facebook to protect their pictures and information.

#### **Talking to Your Son**

Whatever the problem, it is easier to solve if you can communicate. But young men can be prickly. Find ordinary times to connect: Bring your son along when you go for a run or take the dog out. Wash the car or fold clothes together. Ordinary times spent together can be an opportunity to chat about real concerns. Or try talking in the car, it can be easier to share feelings when you're not looking right at each other!

With life happening at a million miles an hour taking the time to talk is not easy, but very rewarding. Also ensure that you have the Eisteddfod dates in your calendar. Week 11, Tuesday 30th June for Year 8 and Wednesday 1st July for Year 7. Looking forward to seeing two amazing nights!
