Success eats its own children! (A 75th Jubilee reflection)

One of my favourite pastimes is a long walk listening to podcasts – particularly to a series about "The History of Rome" – a fascinating history.

Rome as a super-regional power was established after many years of struggle. It was built on the values of the family, the common good of the state, sacrifice, military efficiency and might.

Prestige, power, respect and reputation were earned the hard way – particularly through military conquest, but also through the judicious administration of the provinces.

But over time, reputation and prestige became the values – not how they were achieved. Polishing the military medals of achievement became more important than seeing the barbarians circling the Roman gates.

Over time Rome fell into decline. One commentator described this as: Creativity and sacrifice in the early years led to consumption of power in the later years.

In our 75th Jubilee, we can reflect on the sacrifices that have made St Peter's College over these years. In the early years there were large classes, little money, a Catholic College striving for acceptance into a sectarian Auckland community, - it really was a founding missionary effort by the early Christian Brothers.

The parents who supported the College had large families with modest incomes and occupations. But they had an unshakeable belief in the value of Catholic education for their children. They were about exposing the myth of life being only secular. Their children were to grow up with the knowledge that God had a name, and faith being part of life.

But the success that followed the early sacrifices, was not necessarily picked up by all

its children or late generations.

In 2001, after St Peter's College had narrowly won the National Rugby Championship (through hard struggle), I was walking with the late Boris Srhoj (coach of the 1st XV) through a group of boys, who were bragging to each other, saying in effect – all you need to win was simply to turn up!

They were reminded very forcefully that was not the case!

Success eats its own children.

Capitalism eats its own children. Revolution inevitably follows.

A triumphal Catholic church of the 60's did not produce followers in the 90's.

A successful 75th Jubilee school will not necessarily produce followers for the 100th Jubilee.

If, however, the school keeps true to the Catholic Tradition, keeps sacrificing for the common good, keeps focussing on positive outcomes for the individual, keeps being creative with our problem solving, and always keeps on building for the future through Faith and Hope in a loving God - then the College may have followers for the 100 year Jubilee!

Enjoy the 75th Jubilee this weekend.






Above: Ronan Murphy competing in the Australian Cup 2 Shooting Competition


