SPC SUCCESS IN THE INTERNATIONAL HISTORY BEE AND BOWL COMPETITION

During the last weekend, a team of senior historians represented St Peter's at the annually held International History Bee and Bowl quiz. Our senior history students were given a chance to exhibit and test their general knowledge skills against other keen historians from around Auckland and Hamilton. St Peter's entered with high hopes following our success in the Year 11 and 12 History quiz from a fortnight ago. A team of 5 students – Liam Powell (13TRE), Alec van Helsdingen (12BOD) and the year 11 trio of Joseph Sothcott (11RIC) Luka Hayward (11RIC) and Rory Keating (11RIC) entered as a team up against the likes of Auckland Grammar, Auckland International College and Hillcrest College from Hamilton.



All our students also entered in the 'Bee' competition which allowed for individual competition. Following a gruelling few preliminary rounds, the top 5 students were announced out of pool of over 30 competitors in both the junior (Year 11) and senior (Years 12 and 13) grades. Luka won a nail biting final round with 2 questions remaining, claiming the gold medal. Joseph won bronze on the final question. In the senior final, Liam and Alec battled extremely well against their 3 Auckland Grammar finalists. Liam was pipped at the post and gained a silver medal. Alec came within a whisker of bronze, narrowly missing out on a tie-breaker question. The team (Bowl) competition and saw our team contest against other schools in a series of 'matches'. Following 2 losses in the first 3 head-to-head rounds, our chances looked slim of making the final four play-offs. The boys rallied and won their final two round robin match ups.

A semi-final against last year's winners (Auckland Grammar B) saw our team win convincingly. A pulsating final against Auckland Grammar A was quiz competition at its finest. No inch was given by either team across four close rounds. We came

away with victory in the final three questions, which ended with a rapturous celebration. This was our first team victory ever in the team competition.

Basketball

It's been a busy couple of weeks for the Basketball Programme at St Peters and by far we have had the best ever year in St Peters Basketball history! For the first time we had the U15, U17 and 1st V (open grade) teams qualify for their respective Auckland Greater Wider Tournaments. For the U15 and U17 this was the first time that the school had teams qualify. Further to this, to add some perspective we were the only school across Auckland to qualify across all divisions in 2016. The 1st V, Junior Prems and Middle School Gold teams also have

either competed or are competing at the Regional tournaments.

Central Zone results:

U15 Gold - For the first time in the schools' history, won the U15A division, beating Sacred Heart in the Final. The boys then advanced trough pool play at the Greater Wider Tournament unbeaten and in a great game Vs Westlake Boys in the final lost by 3 to finish 2nd. Best ever result for this age group from St Peters.

U17 Gold – A great year had by this team too finishing 2nd to a strong MAGS side in the Central Zone U17A grade. Unfortunately, at the Greater Wider Tournament a few injuries played a big part in not advancing to the playoff stages.

1st V – After a trying year last year, placing 4th, the 1st V won the Central Zone Open Grade competition beating Selwyn College in a grade game at the Garden. At the Greater Wider Tournament pool play we placed 2nd but still advanced to the playoff stages. From there the boys beat Selwyn and Manurewa to win the Greater Wider Tournament Open Grade. A fantastic result!

Regional Tournaments:

Junior Prems (Year 9 & 10) – This was the first year that SPC had a Junior Prems team put together to compete at the Zone 1/2 tournament in Rotorua. As such we had a low seeding for our pool in what was termed the pool of death. The boys played some great basketball and narrowly lost a couple of games but ultimately placed 5th in pool. From there the boys cleaned up the lower division to place 17th. As a side note, the other 4 teams placed in the top 10 of the tournament, one of which came 2nd.

1st V – the boys had a tough task ahead of them if they were to qualify for the National Tournament (top 7 qualify) as they needed to beat either Rosmini (Premiere grade winners) or MAGS (Placed 5th in the premiere league) to make the top 8. Unfortunately, it wasn't to be as both sides were too strong for us. The boys then went on to clean up their remaining games to finish 9th.

AIMS – currently our Middle School AIMS team is in Mt Maunganui competing at the AIMS games tournament. There are 54 teams in the Basketball tournament from all over the country. Last year the boys placed 26th from 44 teams, the goal is to finish in the top 20.
