I would hope that they (and their parents) come to realise that the building of character in young men requires a commitment and example of outreach and service.

I would hope that our graduates realise the power of the school motto: **"To Love and To Serve**".



Year 11 Business Studies Market Day

On Friday 18th September, the Commerce department ran the first Business Studies Market Day at lunchtime. There were 5 businesses being operated: PD's Bakery; Brotherhood BBQ; Sugar Daddy's Milkshakes; St. Peter's Brothers T-Shirts; & the Rop Shop (Raro & Popcorn).



This was part of the Level 1 NCEA Business Studies course – an internal worth 6 credits based around running a product based business. The day was a success, the rain held off until literally the minute after the bell went and all businesses learned some important business lessons. Three of the five businesses sold out all stock before the end of lunch. We look forward to the 2nd Market Day in September 2016.





Back in June, St. Peter's College entered 59 students in the University of Auckland Economics Competition. There were over 4000 entries from all over New Zealand. St. Peter's students have performed very well with 25 students gaining a Distinction – which is the top 20% of the entrants (but not the top 5%).

Pastoral Tips for Examination Success

Dear Parents,

With CIE exams underway, NCEA exams in two weeks, and Junior exams also fast approaching, it is expected by now your son is well underway with a structured home study plan. To complement the comprehensive study advice found on the College website I would like to give you study tips you can employ as a parent from a pastoral care perspective.

1. PARENT AUTHORITY - Sit down with your son and clearly emphasise to him the importance of a structured daily study routine.

2. OWNERSHIP - Ask him to come up with some study rules and routines, do not initially do this for him. It is important the first ideas come from him as this will give him a sense of "owning" the issue. Tell him to take ideas from the St Peter's - Study Guide, Exam Tips and Revision Strategies on our school website.

3. COMMITMENT - Both of you sign off on an agreed study plan.

4. NO DISTRACTIONS - Music whilst studying does not work, silence is best. Study groups do not work for boys, studying alone is best. Boys should not need access to the internet whilst studying, they have study notes! (If notes are on SPC net – best to print them off).

In summary do not assume your son knows how to study or is motivated to do so.

Strong and specific directions from Mum or Dad work!
