We welcome students with mild learning difficulties, and specialize in helping children with Dyslexia, Dyspraxia, Dyscalcula, Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD), Attention Deficit and Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) and mild Asperger's Syndrome. Furthermore, we can provide assistance and guidance to any pupil with learning, organisational, revision or exam difficulties and will monitor any pupils with an IEP.

Those who require the most support will work regularly with our experienced team.

When necessary, we offer additional support in the classroom, as well as in small groups in certain faculties around the school.
