# Coronavirus: When is Isolation Necessary?

• A person deemed as a '**close contact**' must go into isolation for 14 days

 A 'close contact' is someone with the following proximity to an infected person:

- •Had face to face contact for longer than 15 minutes
- •In the same space for longer than 2 hours.

• If you live in the same house as a traveller who is selfisolating?

- People living in the same house as travellers that are required to self-isolate:
  - minimise contact with person (avoiding being closer than 2 metres apart for more than 15 minutes).
  - are <u>**not</u>** required to self-isolate themselves. (Ministry of Education, COVID-19 update March 17)</u>

Coronavirus: When is Isolation **<u>NOT</u>** Necessary?

- A person deemed as a 'casual contact' does <u>not</u> need to go into self-isolation
- A 'casual contact' is someone with the following proximity to an infected person:
  - Had face to face contact for <u>LESS</u> than 15 minutes
  - In the same space for <u>LESS</u> than 2 hours.
