Year 9 and 10 Mid Year Examinations 27th June - 1st July 2022

Dear Student and Parents,

The Year 9 and 10 mid-year examinations are being held during week 9, from Monday 27^{th} June until Friday 1^{st} July.

There are 2 sessions of exams per day - mainly held in the Hall - but other sessions are in alternate spaces. Please check the timetable carefully for specific exam locations.

You are expected to be at the Hall or other Exam Venues for the morning session by 8.30am at the latest. Students will be called in thereafter. Students do not go to Yard Assembly.

On Monday and Thursday afternoon sessions, you are expected to be at the Hall or other Exam Venues by 1:05pm at the latest. Students will be called in thereafter.

On Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons, you are expected to be at the Hall or other Exam Venues by 1:15pm at the latest. Students will be called in thereafter.

There is no study leave all week for Years 9 and 10 students. Students will be on site at all times.

As examinations are only 90 minutes in length maximum, there are no toilet breaks during any exam session.

Students are advised that in the time period between examinations the school is in session as normal for Years 7-8 and 11-13 and that this is respected fully.

Any examinations that are not taking place in the Hall will follow the same process in terms of starting times. Please read your timetable carefully, and, if in doubt, check with your teacher.

Some Year 9 rotation subjects – Hard Materials, DVC, Coding and Maori – will have their assessment during one period of class time in Week 9. The respective teachers of each class will advise the students of the time of this assessment.

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS

Full school uniform is a pre-requisite of attendance at any exam.

Students are to check with respective teachers regarding additional materials for the exam such as calculators.

Students are to bring stationery in a clear plastic bag.

Students should avoid bringing objects of personal value e.g. mobile phones, iPods, headphones etc.

All watches and phones are to be placed in school bags. Cell phones must be switched off in bags.

Students are advised that there is no eating food or chewing gum during the exam. Water bottles must be transparent with no writing or stickers.

Students have had their attention drawn to the examination rules that St Peter's College has in place. Please ensure that they are followed without exception in the examination rooms.
